

National Physician Survey, 2007. Results for Family Physicians/General Practitioners.

Q28e. Please list any procedural skills that you feel you need to acquire.

Among all Family Physicians: Eighteen percent of family physicians/general practitioners listed procedural skills that they felt they needed to acquire. The procedures most frequently indicated include: musculoskeletal procedures e.g. reducing and casting fractures, joint injections/aspirations and splinting; IUD insertion; chest tube/thorocotomy/intubation; endometrial biopsy; central lines/arterial lines.
