**Q16b\_FM. What areas of training are you lacking?**

Among Family Medicine resident respondents who indicated that their residency training would not provide them with the required knowledge and skill, or that they were unsure if it would, the areas of training that they most frequently indicated as lacking included: procedural skills (28.8%); emergency procedures (23.1%); airway management and resuscitation specifically (19.2%).
