

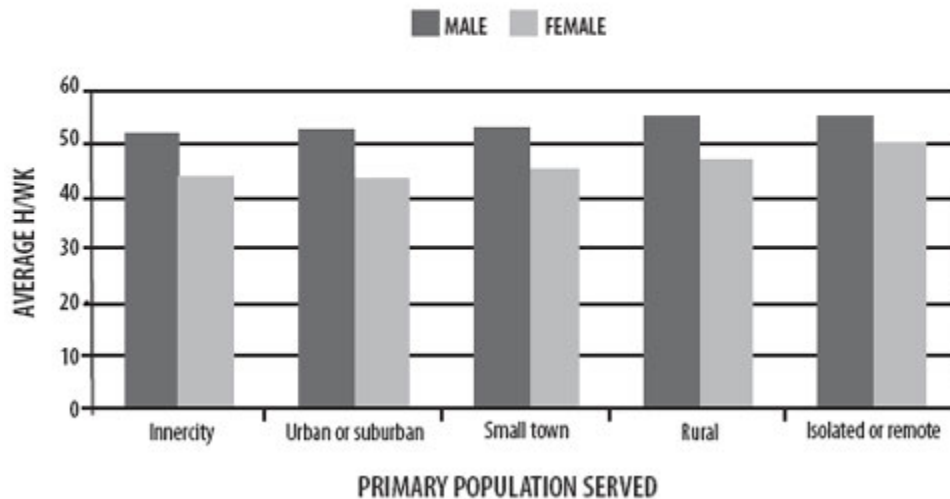

### Janus Snapshots

## Work hours

Canadian family physicians work, on average, 49 hours weekly excluding on-call duty. Most of this time (70%) is spent seeing patients; the remainder is spent on academic, administrative, and other professional activities. Most family physicians (70%) also serve on call. Among these 70%, 15% do 240 or more hours of call service per month. Family physicians' work hours vary significantly by sex and by the type of communities physicians serve (**Figure 1**).

The 2004 National Physician Survey (NPS) is a unique collaborative project of the College of Family Physicians of Canada, the Canadian Medical Association, and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. National-level estimates based on the 2004 NPS results are considered accurate within  $\pm 0.7\%$ , 19 times out of 20.
