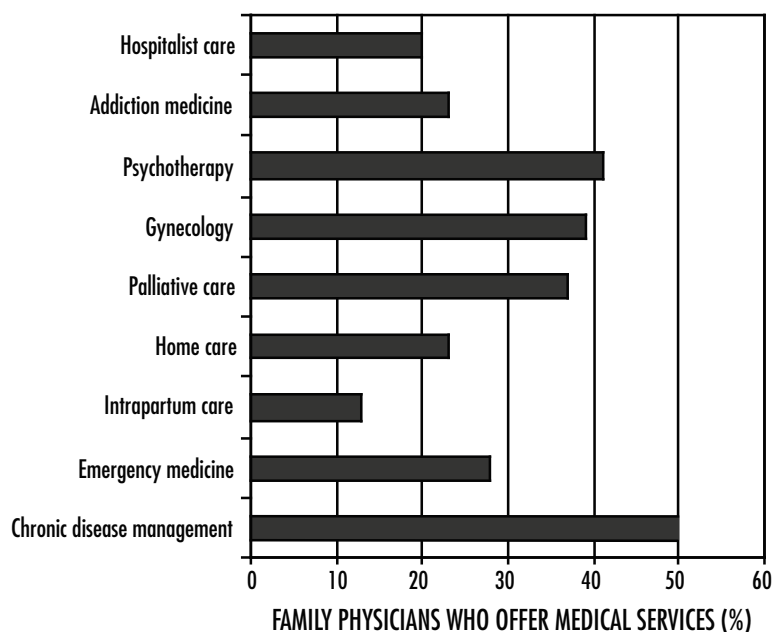
## JANUS SNAPSHOTS

### Clinical services

Canadian family physicians offer a range of clinical services. The most common services offered are chronic disease management (50%), geriatric medicine (49%), pediatrics (41%), and psychotherapy (41%). **Figure 1** shows family physicians' involvement in key medical services.

The 2004 National Physician Survey (NPS) is a unique collaborative project of the College of Family Physicians of Canada, the Canadian Medical Association, and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. National-level estimates based on 2004 NPS results are considered accurate within  $\pm 0.7\%$ , 19 times out of 20.
