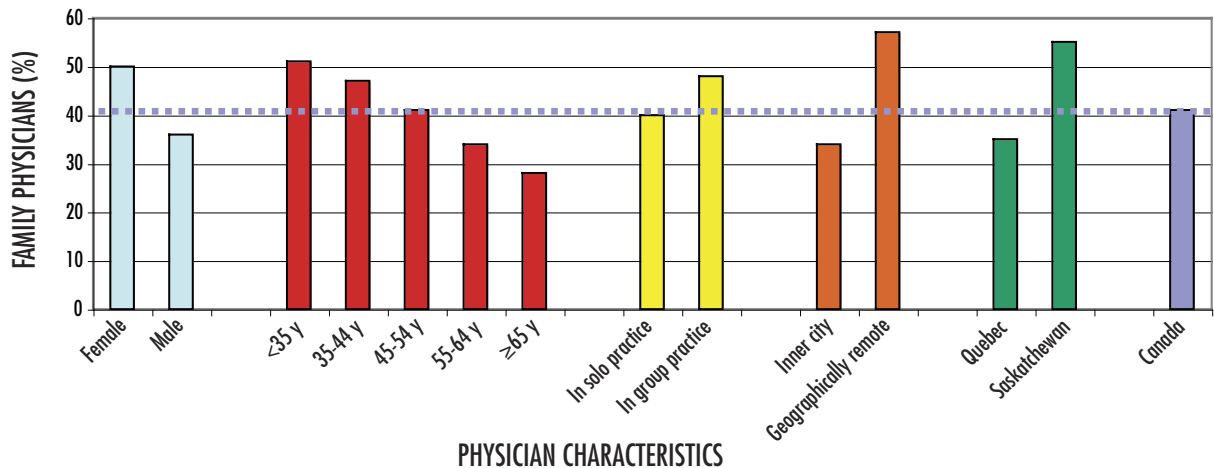
## Janus Snapshots

### Pediatric care

On the 2004 National Physician Survey (NPS), 41.3% of family physicians (FPs) across Canada indicated that pediatric medicine was part of their practice. Pediatric medicine is more often practised by female FPs, younger FPs, rural FPs, FPs working in group practice, and FPs working in Saskatchewan (Figure 1).

The 2004 NPS is a unique collaborative project of the College of Family Physicians of Canada, the Canadian Medical Association, and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. National-level estimates based on family physician results are considered accurate within  $\pm 0.9\%$ , 19 times out of 20.
